### GOSPEL: Matthew 25:31-46

[Jesus said to the disciples:] 31"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. <sup>32</sup>All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, <sup>33</sup>and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. <sup>34</sup>Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; 35 for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, <sup>36</sup>I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' 37Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup>And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup>And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' <sup>40</sup>And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family you did it to me.' 41Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; <sup>42</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, <sup>43</sup>I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' 44Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' <sup>45</sup>Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' 46And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

#### **TODAY AT IMMANUEL**

Our stewardship campaign Alive in the Spirit and Active in Mission is concluded and celebrated in our ingathering and dedication of pledges today. These estimates of giving, and your plans to share of your resources, help our household of faith make decisions about how best we can support the core mission of Immanuel we heard about in our temple talks: worshiping God, welcoming everyone, building community, and working for social justice. If you haven't had a chance to submit your estimate of giving for this year, there is still time to do so! If you haven't pledged before, we'd like to invite you to consider doing so this year. Any estimate for your sharing you can make will help Immanuel plan in an uncertain time.

**Transgender Day of Remembrance is celebrated November 20**<sup>th</sup> and we are just concluding the week of awareness, celebration, and remembrance of those who have died as a result of prejudice and fear. Reconciling Works offers this helpful tool to help us be aware of the diversity in the lgbtqia+ and specifically trans community:

**TRANSGENDER** is an identity many people use whose self-experienced gender does not match the sex they were assigned at birth. For example, a transgender person might be someone who identifies and lives as a woman but whose birth-assigned sex was male. Other transgender people identify as somewhere in between the societally recognized genders of man and woman, as neither, or as one gender at some times and another gender at other times.

**TRANS** can be an umbrella term used to refer to transgender, genderqueer, non-binary, and gender non-conforming people. The colors of the transgender flag are incorporated in this graphic.

**GENDER NON-CONFORMING** people who hold gender identities that are the same as their birth-assigned sex, but do not express their gender identity in ways that conform to societal and/or cultural expectations.

**GENDERQUEER** can describe a person who does not subscribe to conventional gender distinctions but identifies with neither, both, or a combination of male and female genders.

**CISGENDER** describes a person whose birth-assigned sex and gender identity are the same. For example, a person whose assigned sex is female and who identifies as a woman is cisgender.

**PEOPLE OVER DEFINITIONS:** When someone shares their identity, honor that self-understanding by using the words, pronouns, and identity terms they provide.
