



- R A reading from Romans.
 - ³¹ What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³² He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³ Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴ Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵ Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

Commendation


P Let us commend Larry to the mercy of God, our Maker and Redeemer.

We Remember the Life of Larry Lee Lawrence V. Lee

September 12, 1954 — January 30, 2022



Lawrence Vernon (Larry) Lee was born at Saint Francis Hospital in Evanston on September 12, 1954. That day was his parents Vernon and Anna-Lisa Lee's first wedding anniversary. Larry attended Wilmette Public Schools and New Trier East High School; he graduated in 1973. He was retired from the Wilmette Park District where he worked, first part time then full time, since he was 16 years old.

The Lee family loved to travel. Vern and Ann took their children on road trips and camped at many State and National Parks. Larry's international trips with his parents were to Canada, Mexico, and Great Britain. As an adult Larry continued to

enjoy travel, especially by train. He and his parents took rail journeys in the US and Canada. He was a member of the Twentieth Century Railroad Club and loved to visit The Illinois Railway Museum.

In later years Larry's travel focus was on international travel. In 2018 he traveled to Iceland and the week before his death he toured the Panama Canal Zone. He was unhappy that COVID travel restrictions caused a trip to Scandinavia in 2021 to be cancelled. Sadly, a trip he planned to take to Alaska in June had to be cancelled.

Organ music was another of Larry's interests. He enjoyed attending organ recitals in movie theaters, churches, and historic buildings all over the Chicago area. Larry's fascination with organs stemmed from his love of Chicago sports; he especially liked the former White Sox organist Nancy Faust. Larry loved and followed all of Chicago's teams, but his very favorite were The Cubs. Larry is survived by his sister Elisabeth (Lisa) Lee Kmichik, her husband Craig, and niece Allison and nephew Benjamin. He was preceded in death by his parents.
