

Facilities

- Our parking lot is located on the south side of the church off Sherman Avenue. You may park in the lot at
 any time, whether for church events or for shopping or other errands in downtown Evanston; weekdays,
 see the church office at the Lake St. entrance to get a parking pass. Parking meters are free until 1:00 P.M.
 on Sunday.
- The parking lot entrance is an accessible entrance. An elevator is located just inside that door.
- Restrooms are downstairs near the meeting of the two hallways. Accessible restrooms are located near
 the elevator on both upper and lower levels. A gender-neutral restroom is located on the lower level by
 the elevator.
- We love having children in worship! Activity bags are available from the greeters. There is a nursery and changing/crying room for parents to use, if needed, located downstairs. There are also changing tables in both restrooms on this level, by the elevator. An usher will be happy to direct you.
- Hearing assistance is available. Ask an usher for equipment.
- Wi-Fi is available throughout most of the building. The network is "Immanuel," password "allarewelcome". Please use the Internet responsibly!

Receiving Holy Communion

We invite you to share with us in the sacramental meal because Christ invites you! There is no specific age requirement for Communion. When directed by the Ushers, please to come forward to receive the bread from the Pastor and wine or grape juice from the Assisting Minister. The glasses will be pre-poured, with the grape juice in the inner circle and wine in the outer circle. Each person will take their own glass from the tray. The Assisting Minister and Pastor will remain masked during the distribution. Please keep in mind proper physical distance from other worshippers in coming forward and in removing your mask to consume the elements. Empty glasses can be deposited in trays on the front pews. This will be a continuous communion, standing to receive the elements. Please deposit the cups and wrappers in the trash receptacles as you leave the sanctuary.

We welcome all who have gathered today to mourn the death of Joanne Shearer, and to give thanks to God for her life. Today we give voice to our sorrow, thank God for our loved one, and entrust this companion of ours into the hands of God. Trusting in God's promise in baptism that we are claimed by Christ forever, we rest in the sure hope of the resurrection.

and my eyes shall behold, and not another.






Preface *The Presiding Minister begins the prayer:*

Thanksgiving at the Table

P We give you thanks, Father, through Jesus Christ, your beloved Son, whom you sent in this end of the ages to save and redeem us and to proclaim to us your will.

He is your Word, inseparable from you, through whom you created all things, and in whom you take delight.

He is your Word, sent from heaven to a virgin's womb.

He there took on our nature and our lot and was shown forth as your Son, born of the Holy Spirit and of the virgin Mary.

He, our Lord Jesus, fulfilled all your will and won for you a holy people; he stretched out his hands in suffering in order to free from suffering those who trust you.

He is the one who, handed over to a death he freely accepted, in order to destroy death, to break the bonds of the evil one, to crush hell underfoot, to give light to the righteous, to establish his covenant, and to show forth the resurrection, taking bread and giving thanks to you, said: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Send your Spirit upon these gifts of your church; gather into one all who share this bread and wine; fill us with your Holy Spirit to establish our faith in truth, that we may praise and glorify you through your Son Jesus Christ; through whom all glory and honor are yours, almighty Father, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy church, both now and forever.

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours,


Blessing after Communion

P Let us commend Joanne to the mercy of God, our Maker and Redeemer.



We Remember the Life of Joanne Shearer



Joanne Marie Shearer

February 25, 1955 - May 26, 2022

Joanne Marie Shearer (nee Larson) was born on February 25, 1955 to Harold Sr. and Maxine Larson. She grew up in Evanston, IL along with her younger brother, Harold Jr. and attended Evanston Township High School. Joanne went on to attend North Park College and graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Nursing in 1977. During her time at North Park, she met her husband Merle while playing in the concert band together. They were married on August 21, 1976. During their 45 years together, they raised two children - Erik and Kerstin. She was a proud grandmother to three boys all born in 2021.

Joanne was very passionate about nursing and worked her entire career of 35 years at Swedish Covenant Hospital in Chicago and had many roles. She started as a bedside nurse on a medical-surgical unit and in the Emergency Department. She then attended Loyola University in Chicago to become a critical care Clinical Nurse Specialist. She graduated with a Master's of Science in Nursing in 1986 and worked as a Nurse Educator. She was awarded the Division of Nursing Award for Outstanding Achievements in the Profession of Nursing in 1989 for her research work which was published in several nursing journals. Joanne went on to become the Director of the Education Department.

Joanne was a faithful, lifelong member of Immanuel Lutheran Church having been baptized and confirmed here. She served in many ways over the years including teaching Sunday school, singing in the choir, ushering, and Altar Guild. She was also a part of several committees including Personnel, Christian Education, and the Pictorial Directory Planning committee. Joanne helped organize the installation of an AED in the church and the training on its use.

Joanne loved family vacations - train rides out to Montana as a child with her parents and brother, "Shearer family vacation" around the Midwest with her husband and kids (and their spouses in later years), and weekend getaways to Milwaukee with her husband to watch Marquette basketball games. She was a country music fan having seen Alan Jackson in concert too many times to count. She loved and supported her family unconditionally and will be greatly missed.

Joanne was preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her husband, Merle; by her two children, Erik (Amy) Shearer and Kerstin (Andrew) Litwin; by her grandchildren, Aleksander and Thomas Shearer and Arthur Litwin; and by her brother, Hal (Melisa) Larson. May the Lord comfort those who mourn.
