Walking the Labyrinth

Join Kit McCarthy for a short discussion of the history and spiritual practice of walking a labyrinth on Sunday Nov 13th at 3PM. We will meet at the labyrinth on the St. Scholastica property. Enter at the first right turn on Ridge Road south of Howard Street. This small entry road borders the north end of the former St. Scholastica school (now a magnet school) and the residence of the St. Scholastica Benedictine Sisters. There is parking shortly after entering on the right hand side.

Please be advised, there is a short walk to get to the labyrinth, some of it on uneven ground. The labyrinth is on the other side of the community gardens that border the parking lot. While the discussion will be short, feel free to bring a blanket or lawn chair to rest before and after the walk. While walking the labyrinth is a very individual experi-



ence, it should not take more than half an hour or so. The pre-walk discussion will be no more than half an hour.

Kit will be at the labyrinth, rain or shine. If there is lightning, or snow, we will reschedule. Please dress appropriately for the weather as this is an outdoor event.
