Some Food for Thought from the Pastor

During our 'Feeding Our Faith' Sunday morning conversations this fall, we've learned more about our Christian call to be involved in the work of reparations. We



learned about the Biblical basis for reparations, some history of reparations, and how it's about much more than money. It's about repairing relationships, righting past wrongs in ways that bring wholeness and healing. It can take many forms, and we've learned the importance of giving freedom to discern how best to utilize reparations funds to those who are receiving them. This helps break the imbalance of power that made reparations necessary in the first place.

During this Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to join me in discerning how you might contribute to our congregation's interfaith commitment to support the Evanston Community Reparations Fund. This can be a wonderful way to respond to the good news of God's coming to us in Christ Jesus to heal and repair this broken world.

I know that some of you have already contributed, and for that I'm both inspired and grateful. Our total contribution will be added to the other faith communities participating and made public in an event near the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday.

In the Matthean Christmas story, Jesus and the holy family flee to Egypt to escape a tyrannical jealous leader's infanticide. It's a story of Jesus being the refugee. And it connects him to another story of God's liberating his people from their slavery in Egypt. s we enter this Advent season and ready our hearts and lives to celebrate God's liberating presence in our world through Christ Jesus, our Lord, may we be freed to live more generously in how we love and welcome our neighbors. May we be open to God's ways of justice flowing through both our voices and our actions. And may our spirits be ever more open to receiving God's endless outpouring of love. For at the very heart of what we celebrate each Christmas is how God's love became human.

Katherine is the Undergraduate Scholar Awardee for 2022. After her concert, the award will be presented and a champagne reception will follow in Fellowship Hall.

> Katherine Jolliff is a young organist from Indianapolis, Indiana. She began piano studies at the age of 5 and started learning the organ in her freshman year of high school from Marco Petricic (UIndy). After completing her first two

years of high school, she finished her studies at Interlochen Arts Academy. She majored in both piano performance and organ performance and studied organ with Tom Bara. Graduating with honors and the Fine Arts Award in Organ Performance, Katherine is currently attending Eastman School of Music as an organ performance major. In addition to being declared a winner at the Regional Competition for Young Organists competition, she has also won first prize in the East Carolina University Young Artists Competition in organ performance (including the Bach Interpretation Prize and the Hymn Playing Award) as well as first place in the 2021 M. Louise Miller and Paul E Knox Scholarship Competition. Most recently, she won first place in the Immanuel Lutheran Organ Scholar Competition and the Taylor Organ Competition.


Rite of Holy Baptism—Emmett C. Hanson
