Night is falling/has fallen and day's allotted span draws to a close.


The daylight you created for our pleasure has fully satisfied us, and yet, of your free gift, now the evening lights do not fail us.

## Readings

One or more readings from the scriptures are proclaimed. Additional devotional readings may also be used. Silence for reflection may follow the readings.

In response to the readings, one or more of the following may be used: brief commentary; vocal or instrumental music; interpretation and reflection through visual arts or dance.

At the conclusion, a sentence such as the following may be spoken:



- Week 3 Loving immigrants and even enemies
  First Reading: Deuteronomy 10:12-22
  Second Reading: Luke 6:27-38
- Week 4 The love/faith connection
  First Reading: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13
  Second Reading: John 14:15-31
- Week 5 Perfect love casts out fear
