Some Food for Thought from the Pastor

I recall a past Bishop of mine telling me once that the opposite of faith wasn't doubt. He said that the opposite of faith was fear. The theme of our midweek Lenten worship this year will be "Perfect Love Casts Out Fear." We'll reflect on an assortment of Scripture passages that engage this theme. If perfect love casts out fear, and, if faith is the opposite of fear, then there must be a strong faith-love connection. Faith opens us up to God's love for us and at the same time guells all fears that inhibit our loving others. The kind of love that God desires to flow through us into the world is much more than a sentimental emotion. It's a passion for justice, and a heart ready to serve. Love is an emotion in motion. Love is a verb, all actions that make our world a better place. One of the disciplines of Lent is to practice an active kind of love. We're assisted in our loving, through the other practices of Lent, fasting, prayer, self-examination, and repentance. As our invitation to Lent on Ash Wednesday states: we are strengthened in this Lenten journey by the gifts of word and sacrament. These disciplines recenter our live on God, our creator, lover, and provider. God's perfect love casts out the fears that can get in the way of our living out our baptismal heritage of being God's beloved children.

Lent is short for "lengthen." Someone somewhere noticed that (at least in this hemisphere) the season of Lent was accompanied by the lengthening of the days. Lent does not mean "40 days of beating yourself up." It does not mean "40 days of God beating you up and reminding you of what kind of a person you really are." Lent means spring, and the bursting forth of new life as flowers begin to bloom and trees put forth new leaves. Lent is a time for new life to occur within us as well. It's a time for us to be so changed that we blossom with a renewed passion for justice and ways of making God's love known throughout our world. As the light lengthens each day in this Lenten season, may it lengthen within us as well.

3/5/23 – Deanna Van Buren – What a World Without Prisons Could Look Like

Deanna Van Buren designs restorative justice centers that, instead of taking the punitive approach used by a system focused on mass incarceration, treat crime as a breach of relationships and justice as a process where all stakeholders come together to repair that breach. With help and ideas from incarcerated men and women, Van Buren is creating dynamic spaces that provide safe venues for dialogue and reconciliation; employment and job training; and social services to help keep people from entering the justice system in the first place. "Imagine a world without prisons," Van Buren says. "And join me in creating all the things that we could build instead."

3/12/23 – Dr. Gary Mason – Jesus and Religious Ethnic Nationalism

In this moving talk, Dr. Mason walks his listeners through a history of what he calls "toxic religion and toxic politics" and then proposes a way to reframe our understanding of religious violence by looking to the eternal kingdom of Jesus. Gary Mason, is a Methodist Minister, and holds a PhD from the school of Psychology at the University of Ulster. He was also awarded an honorary Doctorate in Divinity for his role in peace building in Ireland, from Florida Southern College. He completed his theological studies at Queens University and holds a Bachelor's in Business Studies from the University of Ulster.

3/19/23 – Dr. Kristen Du Mez – Confronting Our Histories

Dr. Du Mez describes her process of studying the history of White evangelicalism for her

best-selling book, "Jesus and John Wayne," and challenges her listeners to dig deeper into and be honest about our own religious histories. Kristin Kobes Du Mez is a New York Times bestselling author and Professor of History and Gender Studies at Calvin University. She holds a PhD from the University of Notre Dame and her research focuses on the intersection of gender, religion, and politics.

3/26/23 – The Right Rev. Robert Wright – The Leadership that Love Demands

Bishop Wright challenges his listeners to think of leadership as a "delivery system for love" and provides insights into how to develop the leadership skills necessary to best love our neighbors. The Right Rev. Robert Christopher Wright was elected June 2, 2012 as the 10th bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta.
