# Some Food for Thought from the Pastor


I was listening to the news on NPR recently when the person being interviewed, Rain Wilson, who played Dwight on The Office, and just came out with a new book titled, *Soul Boom*, shared how our culture needs more experiences of the sacred on a daily basis. I happen to agree with him. I believe that attentiveness to the sacred is essential for abundant living. One of the great gifts of spending years in the sacred practice of spiritual direction has been to savor times of joy, process time of struggle and sorrow, and sense God's loving presence through it all.

This got me to thinking how we as a congregation might offer sacred experiences to people in the Evanston community. Sure, we do this each Sunday morning with our vibrant worship, but I'm wondering more about other ways, especially with those who wouldn't dare to join us for worship but might enter our doors for other reasons like the indoor winter farmer's market. Currently our leaders are exploring additional ways that our hosting the market can be ministry. We've begun to brainstorm how we might leverage this opportunity to engage with folks in the community in new ways. I invite you to participate in this process and share your creative ideas with our leaders. More information and questions to ponder and respond to are in a letter from the task force included in this newsletter. Imagine if you were someone who had given up on organized religion or didn't have a religious upbringing at all. What kind of activity at the market might touch your soul and give you a taste of the sacred? What might help us to communicate how God's grace is undeserved and free? What might give people an experience of God's loving justice in the world?

Please keep in mind that our goal isn't to get people to join us for Sunday morning worship, though of course they would be welcome. The goal is simply to invite folks to experience a taste of the sacred already present in our world. Seeking in a variety of ways to provide opportunities to experience the mystery of the God, who is love. I also believe that we need to keep in mind the religious and unreligious diversity of all who come to the market. Many, I assume, will chose not to participate, and yet may be intrigued by whatever we decide to offer and do. The goal is simply to provide people with an experience of the sacred. May the Spirit be our guide in revealing the abundant life of living in and through divine love.

# Indoor Farmers' Market Scenes

On April 1st we said farewell to another successful Indoor Farmers' Market season. We were happy to welcome back Curt's Café, who served up delicious hot breakfasts and take-out sandwiches and salads. Also back to the final market of the season was Northwestern University's Purple Pantry, who collected a vast array of pantry food items for students grappling with food insecurity, especially in light of the recent economic inflation.

This market season also was the final season to be helmed by innovators Laura McDaniel and Chris Djuric, and we thank them for their decades of effort and love to this ministry. Now, IFM enters a season of reflection. A Task Force has been formed and is interested in learning what Immanuel members feel is the next era for IFM. Dear Immanuel Friends,

As many of you know, Chris Djuric and Laura McDaniel have recently stepped down as leaders for the Indoor Farmer's Market, which Immanuel has hosted for many years. In fact, Immanuel has hosted an Indoor Farmer's Market for about a quarter of a century. When it first started, it was a onetime event on the Saturday before Thanksgiving where farmers were invited to sell their goods. The proceeds went toward supporting Immanuel youth attending the Youth Gathering that occurs every three years.



Over time, we developed a strong relationship with the farmers, who appreciated Immanuel's welcoming atmosphere. The farmers eventually approached Chris Djuric, asking if Immanuel would be willing to sponsor indoor farmers' markets throughout the winter, as their current venue was not large enough to accommodate all the farmers and their products. This led to an expansion of our Faith That Feeds ministry ultimately resulting in thousands of dollars being contributed to groups that feed those in need.

Now, we are at a time of reflection on this ministry. The Council has formed a task force consisting of Grace Yarnoff (gyarnoff@gmail.com), Michael Kloster (mikekloster@gmail.com), Pastor Mark (pastor@immanuelevanston.org), and Kit McCarthy (kit.mccarthy@comcast.net). Our task is to assess the feasibility and desire of Immanuel to continue hosting the indoor farmer's market and, if so, determine what is needed to move forward. We have good information from Chris and Laura to ground our initial conversations. The task force has already decided that more than two people should be responsible for this endeavor. We are currently identifying the areas that require attention and seeking volunteers from Immanuel who would be willing to help.

Thank you to all who helped Interfaith Action's staff with running the April Emergency Overnight Shelter!




We helped to host about 25 indviduals each night starting with April 9th, Easter Sunday night, until April 29th. Our volunteers assisted IA's paid staff members to set up cots, put up signs, and ready the supply of blankets and sheets to be distributed to guests, and welcomed them as they arrived.

In the morning, Immanuel members helped with the morning tasks of seeing to it that guests were ready to leave by 6:45 am; stuffed the used blankets and sheets into laundry bags, put the full laundry bags outside to be picked up, disinfected the cots, took down the temporary signs, and picked up debris.
