Some Food for Thought from the Pastor

June is Pride month in which we advocate for and celebrate LGBTQIA+ folks as God's beloved children in ways as diverse as the colors of a rainbow. As a straight cisgender male, I can't speak for folks under the LGBTQIA+ umbrella, but I would like to share what I believe we can learn from them and celebrate with them this month. Within a world that is often not only exclusive, but also dangerous for LGBTQIA+ folks, I applaud their courage to be and become as fully as possible who it is that God has created them to be. This is a lesson we all need to learn and follow. How can we develop the courage to be the unique child of God that we've been created to be, especially if that goes against external expectations that have been placed upon us?

Pride month exemplifies the courage needed, not only to be oneself, but to advocate for justice, equity, and fullness of life for all, and especially those who are oppressed because of being different. As the first letter of John reminds us, our courage for this work of justice stems from our being loved. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. (1 John 4:18)

As a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation we commit ourselves to not only welcome all, but also repent of the devastating history of hurt that has been inflicted on LGBTQIA+ folks by the Church, and still happens in some parts of Christianity today. May love cast out our fear and empower our welcome, our advocacy, and our celebration of God's diversity in how we human beings have been created. Sexuality is something that we share with a wide swath of creation. Pride month gives us an opportunity to celebrate sexuality as an incarnational goodness. It's an opportunity to celebrate who we truly are and be freed from any shame we harbor because of our sexuality. Whatever the makeup of our sexuality or asexuality, it is an integral part of how God knit each of us together in our mother's womb (Psalm 139). The psalmist goes on to declare, we are marvelously and wondrously made. God loves the complex diversity of creation including the complex diversity of humanity. So, fall back on God's love this whole month long, let it cast out all your fear and guide your advocation and your height all that God has created you to be Pocal that we are all created in

Getting to the Festival

The festival takes place at Raymond Park in Evanston. Raymond Park is a grassy square between Lake, Grove, Hinman, and Chicago Ave. We strongly suggest taking public transportation. Find directions here. Street parking may be difficult to find around the park. There are parking garages located at 1501 Sherman Ave. and 500 Davis St. These garages are not affiliated with the festival and are provided for information only.

If you can, plan to arrive in the area a little early and cheer on the **Evanston Pride Youth Car parade** as it passes by Raymond Park on Chicago Ave. We are also walking distance from one of the official gathering places, in Fountain Square.

When you arrive

Visit the information booth at Lake and Hinman to pick up a schedule and your ticket for free ice cream from the C & W Ice Cream truck! Volunteers at the information booth can also connect you to every thing else the festival has to offer!

ASL interpretation will be provided for all mainstage acts and is also available as needed throughout the festival. If you need an interpreter, please check in at the information booth!

Safety and Security at the Festival

The Interfaith Family Pride Festival aims to be a welcoming, safe place for all, but especially LGBTQIA people and youth. Volunteer Marshalls wearing purple vests will be present to assist you with any concerns. A first aid station and mental health volunteers will also be available.

Food and Drink at the Festival

We are so excited to have the C & W Ice Cream Truck on hand! We have a limited number of tickets for free ice cream available to attendees -- be sure to stop by the information booth to get yours! Free popcorn and cotton candy are also available, and the City of Evanston water truck will be on hand. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own water bottle!

Raymond Park is conveniently located near the Main-Dempster Mile and Downtown Evanston. We encourage you to check out one of the dozens of nearby eateries before or after the festival!
