Some Food for Thought from the Pastor

I've been a daily Wordle player for a year or two, and as I was looking for inspiration for a summertime newsletter article today's solution was like a homerun at Wrigley. I began reflecting on the many spiritual dimensions to this common 5-letter word that might not be readily apparent. I believe this particular word is an important spiritual practice that blossoms into joy and gratitude. It is most commonly associated with food, in which it has its origin, but can aptly be applied to all of life. The word is savor. And summertime offers ample opportunity to savor the gift of being alive with all the blessings this entails. Vacations are great times get away from normal routines and savor many aspects of our lives, the gifts of family and friends, work, education, hobbies or activities that fill us with joy. Longer days give us more opportunities to get out in nature and savor the beauty of the world around us.

One of my favorite aspects of spiritual direction is taking some dedicated time on a monthly basis to reflect on the happening in my life, to pay closer attention to what's been taking place and to savor both the joys and the sorrows. Savoring one's life can be a key component of growing old gracefully. As a pastor, I've visited with many folks who through illness and aging have had to give up former activities that brought them joy. Yet, those who remain joyful rather than bitter, continue to savor those things that initially brought them joy. I've seen many a face aglow as they share about the places they've been, the things they have done, and the relationships they've been blessed with. Savoring brings the past into the present. It can bring healing as well as joy. By taking time for savoring, we can fully taste the variety of flavors in our one-of-a-kind life.

Each Sunday, as we gather for worship be sure to take time for savoring. We savor our baptismal identity of being God's beloved children. We savor gifts like forgiveness, faith, and being the mystical body of Christ. The reflection time after a sermon can be chockfull of savoring, likewise during the offering, or the postlude.

As I write this, I'm at home with a pretty severe case of Covid, and yet, that actually gives me an opportunity for savoring the care and concern that many of you have shown for me and continue to savor the vacation from which I just returned. A couple of days ago, I watched the movie, *Origin*, which is based on the book by Isabelle Wilkerson, *Caste: The Origin of our Discontent*, and I find that I've been savoring the stories and concepts so artistically presented. I savor Isabelle's vision of a world in which the humanity of all people is equally valued, for as she says, "None of us are free, until all of us are free."

So, take some time to savor different aspects of this one wild and glorious life that you've been given to live, for your savoring honors the giver.

Pride Sunday




Donations for Immigrants

MY HOME, OUR STORY

Evanstonian Laurice Bell will be a special guest speaker during Immanuel's Sunday Coffee Hour. In February 2023, Laurice became the Executive Director of Shorefront Legacy Center, a history organization that collects, preserves and shares the stories of Black individuals who have lived — sometimes invisibly — throughout Chicago's North Shore. Laurice and Ron Whitmore co-founded and co-produce *Evanston Rules*, a podcast which explores the history and stories of people who have made a difference in Evanston.

She will speak a bit about her story and about the Shorefront Legacy Center, and why their work informs what they do to advance racial and social justice.
