Some Food for Thought from the Pastor

October 4 is our commemoration of St. Francis of Assisi, who was known to preach to the birds of the airs and animals of the forest. Francis loved creation and counted all of God's created beings as his siblings, like sister moon, brother sun, sister bird, and brother oak. Recalling Francis' connection to creation can assist us in recognizing our own connection, and our God given responsibility to care for creation.

Climate Justice theme for Sunday morning "Feeding Our Faith" discussions will extend through October. One of the potential videos for discussion is a TED talk by Al Gore in which he shows a picture taken from space as the sun sets over the curvature of our earth revealing the thin light blue area of the breathable air mass in our atmosphere (roughly 3.75 miles high) that makes our existence possible. For the last two and half centuries we've been treating it like an open sewer. It's time that we get very serious about reducing what we put into that open sewer, while we still have time to mitigate the direct of symptoms from our planet's failing health.

The solar panels being installed on our fellowship hall roof are one small step towards reducing what goes into our air mass open sewer. Once they are installed, I propose that we should hold a dedication of them and in the process dedicate ourselves to further caring for the health of this planet that the health of us all depends. I anticipate creation care to be a major focus for our advocacy topics at this year's Indoor Winter Farmer's Market, and I look forward to our learning from one another further ways that we steward our responsibility to care for God's creation. We have a new Green Team, called to lead us all in being and becoming a Green Congregation. I for one am open to learning more about how to best engage in this venture and hope you are too.

We'll conclude on the last Sunday of this month with a joint Reformation Worship with other local Lutheran congregations at St. Paul. It's important for us to keep in mind that Reformation is an ongoing movement. So, let's all be re-formed as stewards of creation, doing our part to care for the health of our planet. By doing so we're fulfilling our baptismal call to work for peace, justice, and abundant life for all.

Scenes from God's Work Our Hands Sunday, Sept. 8, 2024














