

We then close out the choral season with an arrangement of the "Tallis Canon" by Brenda Portman called "O Splendor of God's Glory Bright." We wish the choir a wonderful summer respite and look forward to their return to worship on September 7th. Enjoy the summer!

# Chicago-Midwest Chapter of the Organ Historical Society Organ Recital: Dr. Christine Kraemer

Immanuel's Principal Organist, Dr. Christine Kraemer, will play an organ recital on Sunday afternoon, June 8, 2025 at 3:00 pm in the Sanctuary. It is Pentecost Sunday, so the program opens with an arrangement of "Veni Creator Spiritus" by Wilbur Held and closes with a setting of "Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord" by J.S. Bach.

Freely composed works from the 17th-20th centuries by Dietrich Buxtehude, Jehan Alain, and Josef Rheinberger alternate with hymn settings by 21st century American composers Rebecca te Velde and J. Roland Braithwaite to fill out the program.

You are invited to come early or stay after the recital to ask questions about the organ! The recital is free and open to the public. Please bring your family and friends.

Have a great summer, & see you in September!


# Joint Pentecost & Pride Sunday Worship Sunday, June 8, 2025, 10:30 am

Join **The Beacon for Thursdays at 7, Shine the Light**, as we bring our voices to the street **every Thursday.** 

Each week, we will make our voices heard wherever we are. As beacons, we can shine light by making a sign and bringing it outside—in front of our houses, apartment buildings, to our street corners, subway stops, etc. In Evanston, the large-gathering locations are Ridge and Dempster, Chicago and Main, and Central and Central Park.

Our signs will proudly share whatever we're feeling in our souls in the face of this regime's actions. Our signs might read, "I Stand With Our Immigrant Neighbors," or "Honk if You Love Ukraine," or "Trans Rights Are Human Rights," or "Read Banned Books." Together, we will build visible resistance and organized compassion, meet our neighbors, and join together in acts of solidarity.

**Event:** Thursdays at 7, Shine the Light!

When: Every Thursday at 7 p.m. in your time zone, starting March 20

**What:** Make a sign that is bold, colorful, and shares what you stand for and what you hope to see our nation reflect.

Print The Beacon's QR code in whichever size you like and add it to your sign.

Take a selfie, group photo, or video, as you hold your sign(s). Share it on your social media so others hear your message and join in to Shine the light, too!

**Where:** Wherever YOU are. Let's get outside in front of our houses, apartment buildings, on street corners, at our subway stops, etc. Bring a chair if you like. Bring a friend, or many friends.

#### MIA Blue Recycling Bin Is Back!

LRS Waste Management has replaced our blue recycling bin three times, free of charge! However, we were cautioned that they cannot keep doing this, so all Immanuel members are asked to help with the new procedures of the blue recycling bin. The bin should be kept by the courtyard doorway by the elevator. The bin will be taken to the alley on Thursdays, the usual collection day, and returned empty back inside. If you notice the bin is full, please take it outside only on Thursdays and return it promptly inside—even if the collection was missed and the bin is still full.
